## **NMMC Opens New Photographic Exhibition**

**Triangle, VA** – The National Museum of the Marine Corps has opened a new exhibition of more than 30 photographs depicting varied Marine Corps operations during 2020.

The images in this exhibit, curated by the Marine Corps Communication Strategy and Operations (COMMSTRAT) community, were captured by COMMSTRAT Marines and civilians from air, land, and sea. Covering everything from boot camp to exercises with allies, firefighting to innovation and comradery to determination, the images provide a glimpse into today's Marine Corps.

This collaboration with COMMSTRAT gives visitors an opportunity to see the modern Marine Corps as the Museum continues work on the Final Phase galleries that will tell these stories in a more permanent way. The Final Phase galleries will cover Marine Corps history from 1976 to today. The photographic exhibition will be updated annually, allowing Museum visitors to see the Corps' recent activities and operations.

The COMMSTRAT occupational field is responsible for producing written and visual communications products to build understanding, credibility, and trust of the Marine Corps to a diverse internal, domestic, and international audience.
